

**Довідкова інформація
щодо обґрунтування зниження вартості на мойву
для уникнення необґрунтованих коригувань заявленої митної вартості**

Промисел мойви здійснюють такі країни як Канада, Ісландія та Норвегія.

Ключовим фактором, який впливає на вартість є обсяги вилову, які регулюються відповідними квотами на вилов. Збільшення чи зменшення обсягів вилову в одній країні позначається на вартості продукції у інших.

Для прикладу, взимку 2014/2015 у водах Ісландії було виловлено 517 тис. тонн, через рік загальний вилов склав 174 тис. тонн, а в 2017 та 2018 роках – близько 300 тис. тонн. У 2019 та 2020 роках вилов мойви в Ісландії, як і в Норвегії, був заборонений, що позначилось на вартості мойви з Канади, яка зросла.

Проте, в жовтні 2021 року Ісландським інститутом морських досліджень було оголошено про рекордну за 20 років квоту на вилов мойви на рівні 904 200 тонн, що призвело та продовжує призводити до суттєвого та стрімкого зниження цін та повернення їх на попередній рівень 2017-2018 років, в діапазон 0,65-0,85 дол. США.

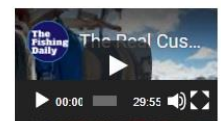
Iceland announces preliminary capelin quota of 904,200 tonnes for 2022

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The Icelandic Institute for Marine Research had announced the preliminary total allowable catch for capelin in 2022.

The MRI recommends fishing for up to 904,200 tonnes of capelin for the coming season, a hefty increase on the predicted quota for 2022.

The last few years have been rather sparse, so there has been a considerable increase since last winter, when the quota was 127,300 tonnes.

This will be the largest measure in 20 years, but according to information from the Icelandic Ministry of Industry, it is planned to confirm the agency's advice soon after the weekend.

Initial advice provided in December last year, based on measurements of immature juveniles in September 2020, spoke of fishing for up to 400,000 tonnes for the coming season. However, this advice was taken with great caution in light of the uncertain relationship that exists between juvenile capelin and fish stocks a year later.

Preliminary results from the capelin expedition of the marine research vessels Árni Friðriksson and Bjarni Sæmundsson earlier this month seemed to confirm the expectations that have been raised regarding the coming season.

The capelin season has been very volatile in recent years. In the winter of 2014/2015, 517,000 tonnes were caught, a year later the total catch was 174,000 tonnes, and in 2017 and 2018 it was around 300,000 tonnes.

In 2019 and 2020, capelin fishing was not allowed inland, but the quota ended at 127,300 tonnes last winter after extensive capelin searches and deprivation of advice.

Of the total capelin fishing quota issued by Iceland, 80% will go to Icelanders, 15% to Greenlanders and 5% to Norwegians. There is also an agreement between Iceland and the Faroe Islands that they will receive 5% of the total quota, a maximum of 25,000 tonnes, which is taken from the quota Iceland has allocated to itself following coastal state agreements.

Final advice will only come when the cruises are completed in January 2022.

MFRI Advises Greatly Increased Capelin Catch Quota for 2021-22

The Marine and Freshwater Research Institute of Iceland has set its new advice for capelin catch quotas for the 2021/22 season at 904,200 tonnes following this autumn's research expeditions. This is close to sevenfold [last year's quota](#) and a dramatic shift from [2019 and 2020](#) when no capelin quota was issued at all. The capelin catch will have a positive impact on the economy, states Finance Minister Bjarni Benediktsson.

The MFRI's advice is based on the autumn's acoustic measurements but the final catch quota will be issued early in 2022, following further research expeditions in January-February. [Minister of Finance Bjarni Benediktsson told 200 Míður](#) that the news creates opportunities for fishing towns around the country and that it's a positive for Iceland's economy, which is still recovering from the effects of the global pandemic. "This increase in capelin quota would mean that we see an increase in export revenue and more economic growth next year than expected," Bjarni stated.

According to the most recent acoustic survey, the capelin's spawning stock biomass is estimated at 1,833,000 tonnes. The harvest control rule (HCR) aims at leaving at least 150,000 tonnes of mature capelin at the time of spawning in March with a 95% probability. The index of immature capelin (age 1 and 2) was the third highest since
